The City Council of the City of Gun Barrel City, Texas met in a Town Hall Meeting in City Hall Council Chambers, located at 1716 W. Main Street Gun Barrel City, Texas, on Thursday, February 20, 2025, at 6:30 pm.

1. **CALL TO ORDER** – Mayor Brian Crull called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Roll was called and a quorum established. Members in attendance included Mayor Brian Crull, Mayor Pro-tem, Rita Evans and Council members April Burns, Jennifer Jacobs, Jay Burson and Ken Foster.

3. **CITIZEN COMMUNICATIONS (Limited to three minutes)**

Shiloh Holland shared her experience with irresponsible dog owners who surrender or dump their dogs for her and/or other animal rescues to pick up the tab for. Holland shared her gratitude to the Humane Society and connections in the north that shes made. Holland shared the culture of these locations stating in these places laws are obeyed because they are enforced. Its not an option to spay or neuter your pet continuing on stating the culture has to change around here and in order to do that laws have to be enforced.

#### 4. NEW BUSINESS

4.A Introduction of open discussion regarding Animal Control. (City Manager)

City Manager, Dr. Angela Smith advised our goal tonight is to allow our attendees to provide us feedback on the Animal Control Ordinance that was repealed. Smith continued stating While there are some really good things in the ordinance which help Gun Barrel City head in the right direction as it related to Animal Control and our animal problems, our residents spoke and we are here to listen.

But first a little history...this process started in June of 2024 with multiple public input sessions and Council discussions.

- January 23, 2023 – contract with Innovative Animal Management to begin rewrite of Animal Control Ordinances
- June 27, 2024 - Animal Control Ordinance Work Session
- July 23, 2024 - Animal Control Ordinance Special Work Session
- August 27, 2024 - Animal Control Ordinance passed by Council
- November 6, 2024 – Notified Council of petition to repeal Ordinance
- November 19, 2024 - Animal Control Ordinance repealed by Council
- TONIGHT - 1<sup>st</sup> Town Hall/Community Discussion on Animal Control Ordinance
- MID MARCH - 2<sup>nd</sup> Town Hall/Community Discussion on Animal Control Ordinance

But I say all this to say, Animal Control ordinances are important and our Council and our staff have invested a lot of time and will continue to invest time until they work for Gun Barrel City. The Animal Control budget for Gun Barrel is \$122,370 which includes our contract with the Humane Society.



In January 2025, we impounded 15 dogs, took 13 to HSCCL, 1 went to a rescue, 1 was returned to the owner, we had 5 dog bites and 2 cat bites, and just to date in February we have 2 animal abandonment cases our Animal Control Officer and the Police Department are working.

Tonight, we are having a COMMUNITY DISCUSSION regarding changes our residents might like to see with the ordinance that was repealed. It is where Council agreed to start with the discussion. Staff is not proposing starting over, as I shown we have time and money invested in the ordinance. But we do want to make it better and we do want to educate our public on the problems we are having. Our Police Chief will give his quarterly report next Tuesday night at the Council meeting with a full update on Animal Control.

Shortly, the Mayor will ask the Council and staff to join our residents on the floor of Council Chambers. You will see around the room, story boards of some of the hot topics we heard from our residents with the repealed ordinance. Council will move to the tables in front of the dais and staff and our partners will be around the room to visit with our attendees. Please give us your thoughts on the story boards, having comments in writing will help us take this information back and strengthen our proposed ordinances. We haven't hit every area with our story boards, but there is a blank board if you have other comments, please feel free to put them on that board. As I said earlier we will be holding another Community Discussion in March and those comments will help us know what else to highlight at that event. With us tonight are representatives from the Humane Society at Cedar Creek Lake, Feral Heroes, our Police Department and our Animal Control officer. They are here to answer questions and LISTEN to your feedback. But I do again encourage everyone to please make sure you make some notes about how to make our ordinance stronger on the story boards around the room.

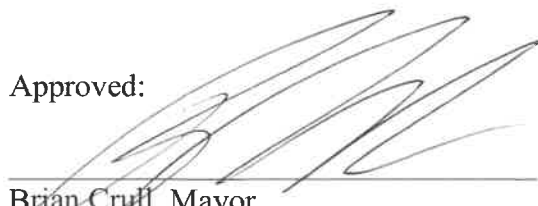

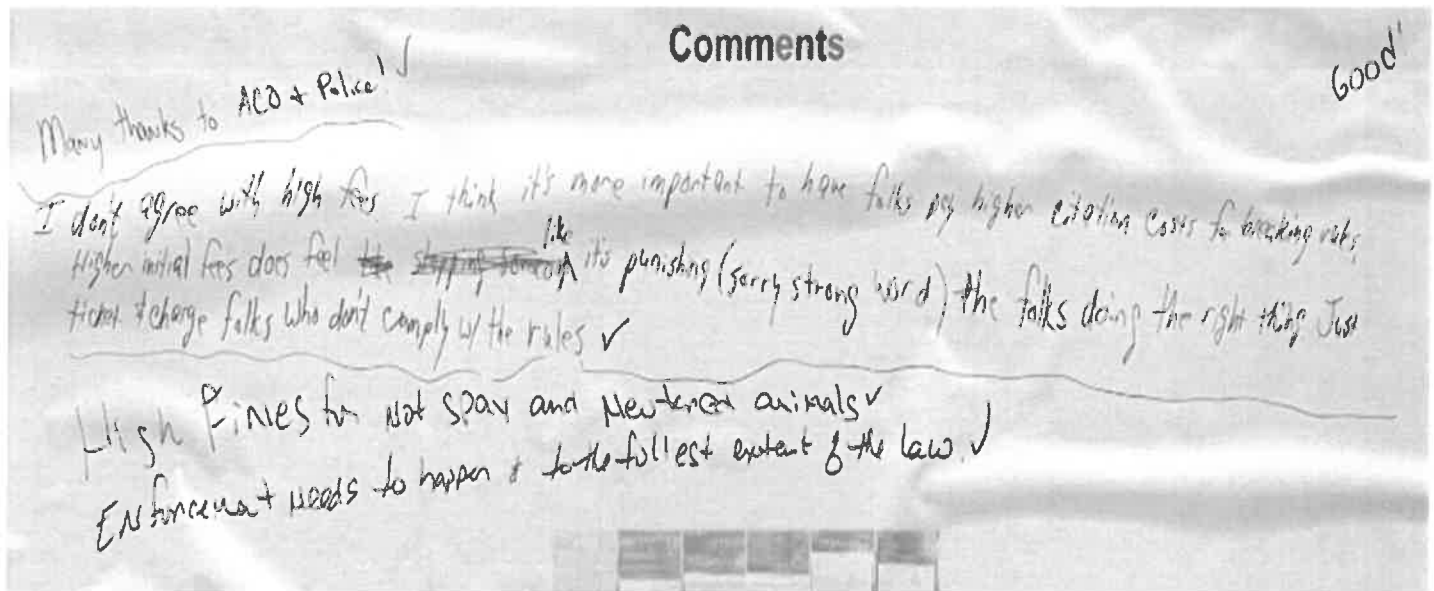

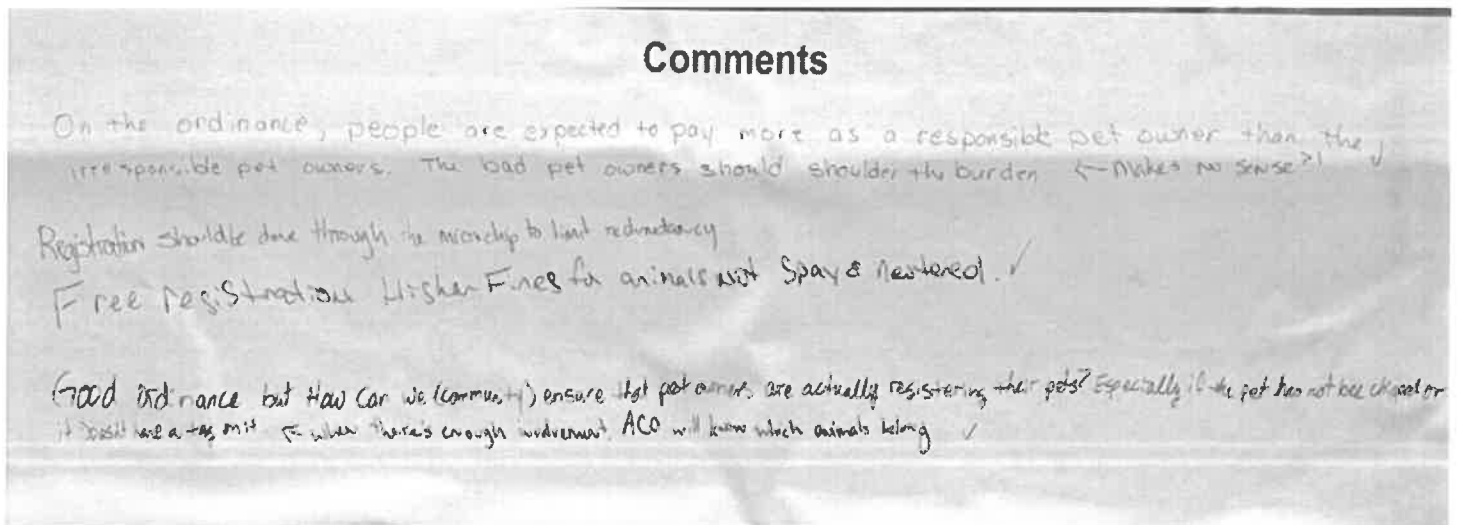
